Will Selina survive to the next round?







Electoral Reform fever

Mauritius has been suffering for the past few months from a severe spell of electoral reform fever. Everyone is talking about it at home and even overseas.

If we are not for ourselves who will be for us, Dravidian saying

Every member of every community has every right to lobby for his or her own community, especially in Parliament, as highlighted by Harish Boodhoo that "chaque jacot protège so mantagne." Harish Boodhoo, in this simple statement of fact, defines with great precision the mental make-up and political inclination of the nation when it comes to the concern of one own's interests. No amount of denial from anyone will wipe out this truth, which is almost an axiom—a self-evident truth that demands no proof.

We say again that the word communalism should not be given a bad name. But as a matter of fact what is the meaning of the word itself that strikes terror in the hearts of so many Mauritians? To begin with, it is a word that cannot be found in any dictionary except perhaps in Hoomooksing/Baker's Creole dictionary? From where does that word come? What is its origin in terms of being racist or sectarian?

The more we analyse this word the more we can't find it to be totally wrong especially when it indicates a necessity to be 'solidaire' to protect oneself against domination and exploitation. This may give rise to the wrong idea that being concerned about one own community's welfare and advancement is a form of communalism. In that respect, all Mauritians are communalists, but not necessarily in any bad sense. On the other hand, only those who practise favouritism in whatever form should be chastised.

In fact, the Mauritian word communalism may find its root in the 1950s/1960s groundless fear of domination/hegemony that was instilled in the mind of the nation to fight independence of the island. It was coined by one section of the community, especially by political leaders, to denigrate and expose the alleged clannish mentality of another section of the community. Another word associated with communalism was 'koonism', coined the same way. Communalism was coined to create fear in the mind of the nation, and is probably still being used for the same purpose. However, it was the fear of that hegemony that every community needed safeguard to protect their rights. Safeguard was essential at the time of independence in 1968, and the same safeguard is essential in 2012. The population is still made up of Indo-Mauritians (Hindus and Muslims), Creoles, Sino-Mauritians, Franco- Mauritians, not much has changed. Are we all communalists for that matter?

The same safeguard, i.e. as in 1968, is demanded by every section of the Mauritian community as embodied in the Constitution of the country. This Constitution was not obtained on a plate or at the drop of a hat. It was given to Mauritius after protracted negotiations extending over several years involving all the political parties under the leadership SSR. SSR put his reputation on the line for this Constitution as a package to the independence of Mauritius. SSR is to this day blamed for the Chagos excision that was allegedly agreed during the constitutional talks in London.

We can sympathise with members of the Muslim community who understand the importance of the guarantee provided by the much denigrated Best Loser System embodied in the Constitution. They understand that what they have was fought for by the first leader of the CAM, Sir Abdul Razack Mohamed (SARM). SARM was denied the same guarantee by former political friends. He found a soul mate in SSR and he gave his party's support to the independence movement. Had he, as leader of a minority, refused to trust SSR and turned the other way, independence could have been denied in the 1960s, and delayed for many years at a time of serious racial tension in the country. It is a great tribute to SARM's memory that on the *stèle* at Place d'Armes dedicated to him, we read his historical declaration:

Independence is historically Inevitable and it will unlock The potential of our nation Let us not therefore oppose It but make a virtue And

A success of it.

The constitutional reform must be done to safeguard the interests of the different races (human of course) making up the Mauritian nation. It should not be for the benefit of politicians in the race to the National Assembly. The practice of First Past the Post is considered unfair, the politicians want even those who never make it to the finishing line to enter the AssemblyShould the Constitution be reformed to please politicians or the people?

It is good to learn that here in the UK one of the Olympic Games' leitmotifs will be to celebrate the diversity of Great Britain. Instead of celebrating diversity in Mauritius they want to push it under the carpet. One wonders as to how will they ever be able to implement the Equality legislation if the ethnicity of the nation already causes the country so much headache. Ethnic monitoring is the most important ingredient in the application of any equal opportunities policy. We can sort of foresee the South Indians (Tamils and Telegus) wanting to be identified as such. As regards the North Indians, the Marathis, the Gujuratis, the Singhs etc may want to stand up and be counted. It's probably better to leave the lid on this can of worms.

Scotland's Devolution

Independent, to be or not to be?

The fervour for celebrating nationhood in the run-up to Burns Night⁽¹⁾ may or may not have been coincidental, but the debate over the future of the United Kingdom ramped up a level in January. David Cameron seemed to have caught many commentators unawares in giving Scotland's First Minister, Alex Salmond an ultimatum - making it clear that his government would welcome a binding referendum on Scottish independence – but only on Westminster's terms.

The fervour for celebrating nationhood in the run-up to Burns Night may or may not have been coincidental, but the debate over the future of the United Kingdom ramped up a level in January. David Cameron seemed to have caught many commentators unawares in giving Scotland's First Minister, Alex Salmond an ultimatum - making it clear that his government would welcome a binding referendum on Scottish independence - but only on Westminster's terms.

Salmond and his Scottish National Party colleagues argue that the Scottish Parliament already has the right to hold a referendum without any interference. Yet Cameron's government has already set itself in conflict with the Holyrood administration. Salmond had previously stated his intention to hold a referendum 'in the second half of the parliament', but Cameron is keen that it be held 'sooner rather than later' – possibly as early as 2013. The government's position can be summarised thus: don't let Alex Salmond get away with breaking up the Union by giving him 1,000 days to make his argument for independence to the people of Scotland. What's more, Cameron's call is for a somewhat simpler affair – a straightforward yes or no rather than asking about the preference for two varying degrees of devolution or independence, which is the SNP's preference.

Publicly, Alex Salmond is portrayed by his opponents as a bully, perhaps in daring to defy Westminster in setting the terms of the debate. Yet, although they might not admit it, many British politicians of all hues secretly admire Salmond, who became Scotland's fourth First Minister in M 2007. They adore the gumption of the man, a formidable parliamentarian and debater who has somehow managed to take both left-wing and rightwing positions, culminating in what the Spectator called 'an extraordinary victory' against eight years of Labour and Liberal Democrat rule in the Scottish parliament. Salmond has managed to steal both the clothes of social democrats while also appealing to conservative tendencies, helping to ensure that the Conservative party itself remains an irrelevance north of the border.

Seeking to get one up on Salmond, it is Cameron who has decided that an urgent debate on the future of the union is needed. And, with little regard for broader constitutional questions, Cameron would like the Union question dealt with once and for all, in order to bolster his own party's credentials as defender of the United Kingdom, and arguably, present a distraction from the government's other troubles. As a result, some have argued that Cameron, rather than Salmond, is playing fast and loose with the make-up of the UK. Little thought has been given to the consequences for England in a UK bereft of Scotland under the current settlement. Independence could, however, provide a resolution of sorts to the socalled West Lothian question, famously posed by the former Labour MP Tam Dalyell, whose constituency gave its name to the issue. This particular issue centred around Scottish MPs being able to vote on English matters – such as funding for the NHS – a peculiarity of the British constitution seeing as English MPs have no such powers in Holyrood.

Major constitutional issues aside, support for independence has jumped to 45% in recent weeks and edging ever faster to 50% in favour. With the Scottish question likely to be dealt with in the next three years, attention would inevitably turn next to Wales, itself emboldened with a devolved government although unlikely to survive without its larger neighbour.

Are we nonetheless witnessing the second act in the break-up of the union? As it stands, it could be remarkably easy for Scotland to decide to go its own way. Some Conservative backbenchers seem already resigned to a seemingly inevitable breakaway, with heightened suspicions of the Prime Minister's true intentions only exacerbated by renewed tensions with Eurosceptic backbenchers. Yet if Scottish MPs were to leave Westminster en masse, it would have a profound impact on the make up of the UK Parliament overall and with vastly different outcomes for all political parties. As Gerry Hassan noted in the New Statesman, 'many Tories have already given up on Scotland and dream of losing the burden of Labour's 41 seats north of the border'. With the impact

of proposed Westminster seat boundary changes taken into account, Labour would lose out regardless. Coupled with the current First Past the Post voting system, the prospect of permanent Conservative rule at Westminster may seem almost certain.

A complete evacuation by Scottish MPs from Westminster would, of course, be the ultimate development. Variants on a theme have included 'devolution max', giving Holyrood the full range of powers over tax but with Scotland asking that defence and foreign affairs remain under the control of Westminster. The SNP has previously also said that it would wish to retain the Queen as head of state, and the pound sterling as currency, meaning that full independence for Scotland with its own tax system, foreign secretary and army may still be some way off.

Regardless of the final

settlement, all mainstream party leaders have demonstrated their 'unity over the union' – whatever that means in the current environment. Desperate to not appear anti-union. Labour leader Ed Miliband's position has seemingly reflected the Prime Minister's own: preserve the union at all costs. Yet Scottish nationalism isn't the preserve of one single party and never has been. meaning that the right to self-determination cannot be ignored. The late Labour politician Donald Dewar (the first First Minister of Scotland) had nationalist sympathies but without the ideological zeal of his SNP rivals. Once again, it may well suit Labour to moderate its position given that not all its supporters in Scotland or those who may vote for the party in the future - will all be quite as positive about the United Kingdom in its current guise as the Labour leader is.

PRIME MINISTER TO RESHUFFLE CABINET SOON

It is confirmed now that the Prime Minister, Navin Ramgoolam will reshuffle his Cabinet ministers prior to the local government elections to be held sometimes in April of this year.

Certain names are mentioned for ministerial promotion such as Kalyanee Jhuggoo, the MP for constituency no 4 (Long Mountain) and Reza Issack, MP for constituency no 19 (Stanley-Rose-Hill). Names of present ministers who may be demoted or be asked to step down are Health Rajesh Jeetah, Satis Faugoo, and Labour Minister Shakeel Mohamed.

AN INVESTIGATION AT DR JEETOO HOSPITAL

The Ministry of Health initiated an investigation to determine the exact causes of the failure of the Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) device at Dr Jeetoo hospital. It should be noted that this brand new machine broke down only days after its installation. The technicians who worked on its installation attributed this failure to the conditions under which the machine was installed

RODRIGUES AFFECTED BY CYCLONE "ETHEL"

The weekend Friday 20th January to Sunday 22nd, 2012, was very bad for Rodrigues especially during the electoral campaign prior the

February Poll day.

Cyclone "Ethel" with a ravaging gust of wind of about 150 miles per hour caused 1 casualty in the person of a 4 yrs old child who died by electrocution following a broken of a live electric wire from an electric pole.

Hundreds of people were made homeless. Roads were blocked by uprooted trees or broken branches. Rivers were over flooded. Many fishermen lost their fishing boats.

BOOKS LOAN SCHEME

MMM Member of Parliament Lysie Ribot, also member of the party's education commission, has proposed that a "book loan scheme" be set up at secondary school level to assist parents who cannot afford new books and stationery for their

children. She says that such a scheme should be run by the Ministry of Education for the benefit of state and private college students. School should also be encouraged to put in place a system of collection and exchange of used books.

A LEAKAGE AT MARE AU VACOAS RESERVOIR

For quite sometimes now Mare-aux-Vacoas reservoir is posing a great problem to both the government and the Central Water Authority. No matter how much we have rainfall in Mauritius, this reservoir is still half- emptied. Foreign experts are puzzled and were unable to detect the real cause of this problem why that reservoir is never full up for the past few years.

Certain local experts reckon that there could be a leakage in the reservoir where all the water escape through an unknown and undetected underground subway inside the reservoir itself

MAURITIUS COMMERCIAL BANK EXPANDS NETWORK

The Mauritius Commercial Bank plans to open a new branch at Bagatelle Shopping Mall. This follows the opening of two branches at the end of last year, namely at Trianon Shopping Park and Cascavelle Shopping Mall. It is estimated that this will cost Rs 295 million for the Bagatelle new branch.

STUDENT IMPORTS ELECTRIC SHOCK GUN

Mohammed Yassine, a 22 yrs old student was arrested by the Port police on Monday the 9th January, 2012. This happened after he turned up at the delivery counter of the Post Office at Port-Louis. The youngster, from a village in the south, had ordered a stun gun on line, which sends electric shocks. As a gift for his purchase, the young man also received a tear gas canister.

iPOD STOLEN AT DIVING CENTRE

A 22-year old man suspected of having stolen several items, including an iPod, in a diving centre on the north coast was arrested by officers of the National Coast Guard for investigation.

A search carried out at this young man's house at Pointe aux Piments had disclosed the stolen iPod. The suspect told officers that he went to the diving centre to look for a job.

GAS EXPLOSION

A gas cylinder exploded on Wednesday morning the 11st January, 2012, at the residence of a woman at Grand Sable. In a statement made at the Grand Port police station she explained that there was nobody home at the time of the explosion.

However, she added that she did not close the valve of the gas cylinder before leaving her kitchen which is made of iron sheets and wooden beams. Firefighters and Mahebourg police were summoned. The value of the damage is estimated at Rs 80 000

BAG SNATCHER IN ACTION

A woman residing at Plaine Verte reported a theft on Tuesday the 10th January 2012 at Pope Hennessy police station. She said that around 3.30 pm a motorcyclist snatched her handbag containing a mobile phone and Rs 20,000 before disappearing.

She was injured during the scuffle. A similar incident was reported to Line Barracks police. A teacher complained about a theft that was committed at Beaugeard street, Port-Louis. A man had threatened her with a knife before snatching her handbag which contained her mobile phone and a sum about Rs 1000.

SUICIDE CASE

A 26 yrs old woman residing in the southern part of Mauritius committed suicide on Tuesday the 10th January,2012.

It was with the help of a bed sheet that she hung herself to a piece of wood. She had made several suicide attempts in the past. Police is still investigating the matter.

BUMPER CROP AT INLAND REVENUE TAX OFFICE

The Mauritius Revenue Authority (MRA), another name for the usual Inland Revenue Tax Office has collected approximately Rs 53 billion in tax revenue in 2011, compared to Rs 49.64 billion in 2010, representing an increase of 7%.

The high revenue yield is due to several initiatives taken by the MRA and also due to changes in excise duties, especially on tobacco and alcohol, which raised Rs 10.7 billion in 2011, compared to Rs 9.32 billion in 2010. Other factors explaining the increase include: broadening of VAT taxpayer base by 18% and Income Tax base by 11% and an increase in e-filing namely 70% corporate tax returns and 64% of individual IT returns.

BANK OF MAURITIUS BUYS FOREX

The Bank of Mauritius intervened on the domestic foreign exchange market on one occasion last wek. It purchased an amount of USD 2.0 million at Rs/USD 29.50 and an amount of EURO.3 million at Rs/EUR37.76.

SBI LAUNCHES ON LINE CEB BILL PAYMENT

The SBI Mauritius bank has launched an on-line electricity bill payment facility. This is yet another innovative service from SBI Mauritius is designed to help customers to save time by avoiding queues. The bank plans to offer similar new services in the future.

SIR ANEROOD JUGNAUTH UNDERWENT SURGERY

Sir Anerood Jugnauth, aged 81, underwent surgery on Monday 9th January 2012 in a private clinic. His family explained that this surgery was planned and that his health problem is no serious concern.

The operation (prostatectomy) which lasted less than two hours was carried out by surgeons. According to his family, the President was already in good shape a few hours later after the operation and had returned to his room in the private clinic.

Such entities are required to comply by 30 March 2012, failing which they will be subject to regulatory actions.

M.K: I came to the village to deposit my memories as one would bring in a bouquet of flowers. These are the images I collected during the years of my absence. They come from various parts of the world. Souillac for me has been a cradle of light and shade and a garden of sensation. The morning breeze comes from the deep sea and arrives laden with the songs of the birds. Here I came to renew acquaintances with the naked soil. To touch the soil where my ancestors came so long ago.

Dodo: What have you learnt from the cosmopolitan style of life that you have led, moving like the nomad and the pilgrim from station to station? It is

obvious that the saying "Rolling stone gathers no moss" does not and cannot apply to Mamade Kadreebux?

M.K: The cosmopolitan life is a very busy one. I have enjoyed the privilege of going to concerts and symphonies. I have attended lectures and heard speeches from eminent scholars, I have enjoyed libraries and book stores and these are part of my present experience. But if a rolling stone gathers no moss maybe it collects dust of the road which in time threw you an experience. Maybe transformed into rubies in the sun. It is a matter of putting these experiences together in a harmonious blend.

Dodo: You have published a few books related to your career as a world famous photographer. Can you enlighten us about these publications?

M.K: For years I sat in front of my photographs during the course of my exhibits done in

Mauritian kestrels saved from destruction

In the series "Nature's Miracle Babies" of ABC Television, 10 January 2012, zoologist Martin Hughes- Games, presented an episode focussing on global efforts to save some of the world's most vulnerable species from extinction. "This week's episode focusses on the world's islands, home to some of the most threatened animals simply because they exist nowhere else", says the program brief


In the program, featured the Tasmanian Devils, the Aye Aye of Madagascar, the Koalas of Australia, the Mountain Chickens (Frogs) of Montserrat and the Mauritian Kestrels, "once the rarest bird in the world, its numbers have spectacularly increased through captive breeding", Martin Hughes-Games said.

The program reported that 30 years ago, it looked like the Kestrel would become extinct, until Karl Jones arrived in Mauritius. "When he arrived, there was a handful of birds. Disease was not killing the birds, but ironically, it was a chemical to save human lives". Malaria was a big problem and the solution of the time was to spray DDT to kill the mosquitoes and it was incredibly effective. However the DDT had another effect on egg shells. They became thin and fragile and the chicks never hatched. The Kestrel numbers crashed.

The Kestrel was considered as a bird that could be bred in captivity. "We climbed up to the nest of the last breeding pair we knew of and we took the eggs. It was a huge gamble. Taking the eggs and hand raising the chicks would force the parents to lay more eggs", Jones said. Some people thought it was a crazy idea, but it proved worthwhile because the number rose dramatically. "With the birds raised in captivity, we established a breeding program and eventually bred enough birds so we could start releasing them in the wild", he said.

Jones said he was sent to Mauritius to stay for 1 or 2 years. 31 years later he was still there. "It started out with a handful of birds, today we've got 500 birds. We hope to get more but at least it's a good start and at least the Mauritian Kestrel isn't going to become extinct tomorrow. It proves that captive breeding can work",



Mr Cutts called for the Com-monwealth to use its tradition of political influence and consensusbuilding to break down entrenched differences in areas including press freedom and human rights.

Foods That Can Boost Your Memory

Age, stress, lifestyle,nutrition and medications can play an important part on our health and deeply affect our brain functions thus resulting in memory loss

Every cell in our body needs a steady supply of oxygen and nutrients to work properly. Oxygen and nutrients are carried into the bloodstream, thus anything that impedes bloodflow can have a negative effect on brain cell function. A healthy heart is sign of a healthy brain. A heart healthy diet is therefore veryimportant for general health and a good memdry. Two newly published studies have confirmed a 2006 finding that the so called

Medititerranean diet" can protect against mental decline with aging. In the "Journal of the American Medical Association", David S.Knopman, MD said that the results of the studies is evidence that the Mediterranean diet is linked to less late life cognitive impairment.

Despite the popularity of the diet there is no such thing as an official Mediterranean diet. But when researching the benefits of diets, scientists found that the diet in areas around the Mediterranean is the one that is most beneficial and should be followed by everyone. This diet contains more fruits, vegetables, legumes, cereals, fish and monosaturated fats such as olive oil and less red meat, dairy products and saturated fats

Research has linked certain specic foods and their nutrients to the enhancement and preservation of memory. These so called "brain foods"contain flavonoids, which are chemical compounds that give fruits and leafy green vegetable their colour. Two important flavanoids that support memory function are found in apples, blueberries, and red onions

Berries

Berries rich in flavanoids protect against the breakdown of brain cells. Blueberries in particular are one of the best sources of flavanoids. Studies on animals point out that diets rich in flavonoids may help to reverse memory loss in animals.

Leafy Greens

Leafy greens such as spinach,kale,mustard greens and turnip greens which are loaded with folate seem to have a direct effect on memory. In a study at on Tufts University, Boston, researchers studied 320 men and tracked their blood levels of homocepteine which is an amino acid linked to a high rate of heart disease.

They found out that those participants who had high levels of that amino acid showed memory decline but those with less levels were protected against memory decline.

Fatty Fish

Healthy fats are important for a healthy mind. Thus fatty fish such as salmon, sardines, herring and mackerel provide a good amount of Omega 3 fats which are excellent for memory.

A study published in the "Archives of Neurology" in November 2006 reveals that people who have the highest levels of Omegas 3s are less likely to be diagnosed with dementia than those with the lowest levels.

Everyone should try to eat three 4-ounce servings of fatty fish per week. If that is impossible, then they should consider using fish oil supplements.

If we follow the tips above and have the "Mediterranean diet", our minds will stay sharp in old age and can be so even when we reach 90 years old.

A VIEW OF THE NEWS IN MAURITIUS

Following the acrimonious divorce of the once lovey-dovey partners of L'alliance de L'avenir, it was inevitable that there would be collateral damages once the dust had settled.

Not a day goes by without claims and counter claims appearing in the local press about the level of competency or should I say incompetency of either political party. Much has been said and written about those who have deserted their camp to join the government ranks as ministers. Should they be called defectors or deserters, take your pick.

I much prefer the term TURNCOATS because it is exactly what I suggest they are. It makes one wonder in view of the recent appointments of some ministers which have been more by default than on any other criteria. Some of them might not have even been first choice and others were rewarded for being prepared to change horses in midstream.

The other fascinating element to note is that the lovelorn leaders (the incumbent and the aspirant) of the defunct alliance are now both eyeing the much coveted and elusive bachelor in the person of the strategist. Will it be the wedding of the year for one of them or will the potential bridegroom play hard to get and lead them up the garden path?

The factor that can prove crucial and tip the balance for either of them will be the little matter of the dowry. What will they offer to tempt him to take the plunge again following his past backbiting divorces with the two respective suitors, alliances that have been very much in the style of the numerous nuptials and splits of two late famous actors?

One does not need to be a rocket scientist to observe that the suitors are knee deep in the mire and that the strategist is holding the trump card, he can call the shots when and how he wants, time will tell if he is astute in his game plan.

There are more surprises in the offing. As I told you before, the saga goes on and on and on ... it is like 24 hour chrono revisited.

Legal Euthanasia Supported by Majority in Great Britain

Most respondents also think that anyone who helps a person to commit suicide should not be prosecuted.

Most people in Britain continue to endorse the idea of legalising euthanasia in the country, a new Angus Reid Public Opinion poll has found.

In the online survey of a representative national sample of 2,014 British adults, 71 per cent of respondents (+4 since October 2010) are in favour of legalising euthanasia in the United Kingdom, while 16 per cent (-3) oppose this idea.

More than four-in-five Britons (86%) believe that legalising euthanasia would give people who are suffering an opportunity to ease their pain, and three-in-four (78%) think it would establish clearer guidelines for doctors to deal with end-of-life decisions.

Respondents are evenly divided on whether the legalisation of euthanasia would leave vulnerable people without sufficient legal protection (Agree 42%, Disagree 42%), but three-in-five (61%) reject the notion that it would send the message that the lives of the sick or disabled are less valuable

In 2000, Heather Pratten of Essex pleaded guilty to aiding and abetting the suicide of her terminally ill son, Nigel, who suffered from Huntington's disease. Judge Graham Boal gave Pratten a conditional discharge instead of immediate imprisonment, due to the "exceptional circumstances" of the case.

A majority of Britons (57%) believe that, if a parent is found guilty of assisting a terminally ill son or daughter to die, there should be no penalty at all. Support for this course of action is decidedly higher among respondents over the age of 55 (65%).

In addition, three-in-five Britons (60%) believe that people who help a person to commit suicide should not be prosecuted.





<u>Immigration Law</u>

Changes to the minimum age limit for spouse visa in the United Kingdom

Background

In 2008, the government amended rule 277 of the Immigration Rules 2004 and provided that a marriage visa should not, in the absence of exceptional, compassionate circumstances, be granted until both the sponsor and the applicant had attained the age of 21. This amendment was implemented in order to deter forced marriage as the Home Secretary took the view that the rule would provide an opportunity for individuals to develop maturity which might enable them to resist from the pressure of forced marriage and/or sponsoring visa.

New changes

In October 2011, the Supreme Court held that the above amendment disproportionately interfered with Article 8 rights of those who were in genuine marriages[1]. The majority of the Court considered that the government has failed to

provide sufficient evidence that the age increase was an efficient factor to deter forced marriage.

Following the ruling, the government has decided to lower the age for spouse visa from 21 to 18. The change has been implemented since the 28th November 2011.

As well, as lowering the age for spouse visa, the UK Border Agency has announced that people, who applied for a spouse visa between the 27th November 2008 and October 2011 and

were rejected because of their age, will be able to have the decision reviewed. The UK Border agency sets out the conditions for applying to have the decision reviewed ^{as} follows:

- 1. The applicant must have received an adverse decision under paragraphs 277, 289 AA and 295 AA of the Immigration Rules between the 27th November 2008 and October 2011, and;
- 2. The application was refused solely on age grounds, and;
- 3. Both parties are aged 18 and over.

If the above is satisfied, the applicant will be entitled for a review. The deadline to apply for reconsideration is on the 31st May 2012. If you apply before, the application would be free. After that date, a new application will be needed and the full fee will need to be paid.

Guy Rozemont's landmarks in the Mauritian constitutional reforms

It will be seventy years this year that trade unionist Guy Rozemont, emblematic figure of the Mauritius Labour Party which he chaired, and a member of the Legislative Council, made his first public address at a Labour Party promoted to this position in May 1941 when the founder, It will be seventy years this year that trade unionist Guy Rozemont, emblematic figure of the Mauritius Labour Party which he chaired, and a member of the Legislative

Dr Maurice Curé, withdrew from the leadership of the Party. Guy Rozemont's adherence to the Labour party in 1940 was sponsored by Emmanuel Anquetil himself. Both were active and committed trade unionists



In the 1940's already, the Labour Party, committed to an extended democracy and the betterment of the lot of the working class, has pushed forward the proposal for a public holiday for the workers (Labour Day) and constitutional reforms.

Guy Rozemont was in the forefront for the achievement of both a larger franchise and a public holiday that would recognize the importance of workers. A larger franchise where the prevailing property qualification would be curtailed, would bring voting right to a mass of workers who would be able to send to the Legislative Council their elected representatives.

Labour Day in the island would go far

Towards the first really popular elections of the island

As early as February 1946, Guy Rozemont was the mouthpiece of the Labour Party at a public gathering held at Company's Garden in Port Louis on the issue of constitutional reforms, organized by Sookdeo Bissoondoyal and Sookdeo Balgobin. The colonial government subsequently approved the idea of constitutional reforms and, on 29 October 1946, the British governor Mackenzie-Kennedy presented to the Council of Government the proposal for a fresh constitution, emanating from the Secretary of State for the Colonies and based on data furnished by the governor of the colony and the Consultative Commission.

it maintained the property qualification and put forward other elements that were not favourable to the working classes, the proposal was rejected in toto by the Labour Party during a public gathering held at St Pierre on 1st December 1946 with the active participation of Emmanuel Anquetil, S. Salabee, Renganaden Seeneevassen, Guy Rozemont, Drs Edgard Millien and Seewoosagur Ramgoolam.

Emmanuel Anquetil passed away in the night of 29 December 1946. Guy Rozemont, then secretary-general, was promoted president of the party. The struggle for constitutional reforms went on: a fresh Consultative Commission was appointed; the various political parties or groups including the Labour Party expressed their views forcefully both in public gatherings and through their mouthpieces in the Consultative Commission.

The president of the Labour Party, Guy Rozemont, was very committed to the idea of a massive extension of the electorate. Ultimately the wish of Guy Rozemont and the Labour Party was fulfilled and the colonial government approved a new Constitution whereby the number of electors increased almost sevenfold. The stage was set for the first popular election of the island:

"Under the old constitution of 1885 the number of electors stood at 11,844 in 1946. Immediately after the approval of the new constitution the registration of electors was completed and in 1948 their number rose to 71,569. The following table shows the number of electors in each electoral district.

Port Louis 13,389 10 007

The first general election under the new constitutional provisions were held on 9th and 10th August 1948. Setting the stage for the first London Conference

One important and crucial impact of the victory of Guy Rozemont, the Labour Party and other socialists, was to crystallize all progressist and proworking class groups and individuals

around the Labour Party.

In this way, Dr S. Ramgoolam adhered to the Labour Party, so much so that "Guy Rozemont and Dr Ramgoolam together made the strength of the party." (M.N. Varma). On the other hand, the Conservatives organized themselves under the banner of the Ralliement Mauricien. In due course, Labour party and Ralliement Mauricien got engaged in a electoral campaign for the second popular election (1953). Their respective manifestos speak for themselves:

While the Labour Party laid stress on responsible government and universal adult suffrage, the Ralliement Mauricien opposed these issues and warned against the annexation of Mauritius with India, the indianization of the country, the devaluation of Western culture. communalism and communism.

The Mauritius Labour Party presented 19 candidates in all the districts against only 9 candidates of the Ralliement Mauricien in two electoral districts (Port Louis and Plaines Wilhems) and independent candidates in all the other districts. In all, 92,239 electors out of a population of 502,000 persons were going to choose between 79 candidates contesting 19 seats.

The elections were held on August 26 and August 27 and the results were as follows - Labour Party (13 seats), Ralliement Mauricien (3 seats) and independent candidates (3).

The overwhelming victory obtained by the Labour Party "settled once for all that the country would move towards more important constitutional reforms." (M.N. Varma). Consequently, "on December 8, 1953, Guy Rozemont, President of the Labour Party and first member for Port Louis, moved a motion asking the Secretary of State to receive

a delegation to discuss constitutional changes for Mauritius." (Idem).

The main demands of the party were universal adult suffrage, responsible government, the ministerial system of government, decrease in the number of nominated members, increase in the number of elected members, changes in the composition of the Executive Council, a speaker for the Legislative Council and the leader of the majority party to be

Conference (12-20 July

The demands of the Labour Party were examined at the 1st Constitutional Conference in London in 1955. representatives of the Labour Party were Guy Rozemont, Dr Seewoosagur Ramgoolam, Renganaden Seenee-vassen and Guy Forget. Discussions on the future constitution of Mauritius took place in London from 12th to 20th July 1955.

Unfortunately, the demands for reform of the Labour Party were torpedoed by the Conservatives and the British Secretary of State through the introduction of the offensive Proportional Representation:

The President of the Labour Party, Guy Rozemont, did not have the privilege to participate in the 2nd Constitutional Conference as he passed away on 22 March 1956, "le jeudi 22 mars, à six heures deux du soir" (Week-End, 16 mai 2004) at the early age of 41.

However, the torch of freedom which he had lit continued to burn. "Par-delà la mort, Guy Rozemont verra triompher son rêve constitutionnel pour l'île Maurice lorsqu'à la 2e Conférence Constitutionnelle de Londres, la Représentation Proportionelle sera tout simplement mise à l'écart. The credit must go to freedom fighter Guy **Rozemont**

To freedom fighter Guy Rozemont must go the credit of both universal suffrage and responsible government, the two constitutional bedrocks on which the edifice of independent Mauritius will stand as from 1968.

But there has been a coterie acting in the dark to erase from the annals of the history of Mauritius the contribution of this stalwart of Mauritian emancipation, Marie Joseph Guy Rozemont (1915-

This treachery has been well underlined lately by PKD in an article entitled "Guy Rozemont, l'oublié du travaillisme" in the Mauritian daily Le Défi of Saturday 21, 2012.
